



## Devon Gardens Trust

### Criteria for a site to be included on the Devon Gazetteer of Parks and Gardens of Local Historic Interest.

These are important designed landscapes in the context of Devon, some of which might merit inclusion on the Historic England *Register of Parks and Gardens of Special Historic Interest in England*.

For a site to be included on the Gazetteer it must be largely intact as a readable landscape, even if in divided ownership (eg Creedy Park, Peamore Park), and with significant remains that demonstrate one or more of the following:

1. illustrates a particular aspect of garden history:
  1. a particular period or style, or succession of periods/styles
  2. has significant intact features (built and /or groundworks)
  3. demonstrates particular artistic, social, cultural or economic influences
2. has unusual or rare garden features of merit/historic significance
3. has known garden archaeological significance whether excavated or not
4. has group value (eg contiguous sites with intervisibility, sites with strong design association or family links)
5. provides an example of the work of a designer of
  1. national/international reputation
  2. local reputation
  3. owner-designer
6. in addition to exhibiting other criteria is associated with a significant historical individual of:
  1. national or international importance
  2. regional importance
  3. local importance
7. is the work of an influential plants-person/nurseryman etc (eg Dr Jimmy Smart, Lionel Forstescue) and/or comprises a significant plant collection **only** if other criteria are also present (plant collections are 'protected' by other organizations like Plant Heritage, NCPG, Hardy Plant Society)
